A Letter from Council President

Equipping The Saints

The local church is called to equip the saints to do the work of the ministry (Ephesians 4). This message is to identify reasons people may not volunteer and our strategy to encourage and equip them for ministry.

Pastor Wayne Hedlund, founder of The Transforming Church organization wrote an article on *5 Reasons Why People Don't Volunteer*. Those reasons are:

What Volunteer Opportunity?

People might not be aware of ministry needs or how to get involved. To communicate more about each ministry team, we will have Ministry Moments during worship services. These short talks will allow ministry team leaders to explain what their ministry are responsible for. Also, we are planning to hold a Ministry Fair where you can talk to each ministry leader. learn more about the ministries and hopefully sign up to volunteer for a ministry team if so desired.

Been There, Done That.

Some volunteers may have had bad experiences in the past. We certainly would like to talk with you about that experience and learn from it.

I Have Nothing to Offer.

A lot of people don't get involved because they don't feel qualified or feel intimated or uncomfortable to try something new. The only prerequisite is a desire to help. Each ministry team has an on-the job training program. You are needed and wanted.

I'm Too Busy.

We all seem busy. The time seems to fly by but the work Christ asks us to do is extremely important. It's life changing and life-saving.

Nobody Asked Me.

Journey articles, bulletin blurbs and worship announcements all frequently ask for volunteer help. Now you just need to discover what volunteer position God is placing on your heart. The upcoming teaching on spiritual gifts and prayer can help you with this.

The *Life of a Steward* website says the biggest mistake a person has in finding their calling is they believe that their comfort level is an indicator of God's call on their life. They believe that God has given them certain gifts and if this takes them out of their comfort level it is not God's will.

The *Renewing Hope* website says your uncomfortable heart may mean God is trying to:

•Have you unlearned some old ways of thinking or behaving.

Stretch you into a new area of increased effectiveness

•Uncover an ungodly character trait in you that He wants to transform

•Raise your sights beyond yourself to see others in need

•Push you to become someone capable of much greater responsibility

•Invite you to be an effective agent in spiritual warfare for His kingdom

Are you uncomfortable? Consider whether God may be behind it, and see where the warmth of your burning heart may take you.

I remember the first time I was asked to give a temple talk. I thought my heart was going to pound right out of my chest. They say the fear of public speaking is one of the worst fear a person has. It is ranked higher than the fear of death. I did survive and grew more confident from this experience. I wasn't comfortable when a group of TLC church leaders cornered me to ask if I would run for TLC president. I wouldn't trade this experience for anything. It still can be uncomfortable at times but I grow from each of these times. If I can try something new, you certainly can do it. You might not realize all the skills and talents you have. You are needed and you can make a difference. The benefits of volunteering are fulfilling God's will, being part of a small group, establishing new friendships and the satisfaction of doing a job well done.
