PASTOR JACK'S COLUMN

"Thy word is a lamp unto my feet, and a light unto my path." – Ps. 119:105

It's been nearly a year and a half since I received a phone call from my son, asking if I'd send him some uplifting scripture or devotional-type encouragement each day. It was a Sunday evening, and he was just getting back from another weekend escapade with his college buddies in Lacrosse. Driving back on his own, he called me from his car to share that he wasn't feeling good about the direction his life was taking or the focus on which his time was being spent. He knew he was meant for more. I was grateful for his vulnerability with me, and his mature selfreflection. This was a great opportunity for both of us.

I agreed to send him scripture every day, if he agreed to read it. I suggested we start in the book of wisdom; Proverbs. He liked that idea. We didn't start from the beginning; it was the 17th of the month, so we began there. One chapter per day. Proverbs is great for this, especially between fathers and sons, as there's timeless wisdom passed and an accountability that lands on both ends. The YouVersion Bible app on my phone also allowed me to easily switch between different translations. This helped make the text more relevant when needed.

I'd simply "copy and paste" the scripture to my phones text window, add a few thoughts on its meaning, and close with a personal encouragement. He just had to read it. Sometimes he'd comment, sometimes he was silent. Always he assured me he was reading. A couple weeks went by, and my oldest son discovered our texts. I was pleased when he asked if he could also be part of this daily Scriptural sharing. I made the same deal with him, and created a group text. Not long after, my youngest son graduated from Navy boot camp; this meant he now had access to his cell phone. Yep! He too asked if he could join the group!

My sons are all in their 20's. As I write this, we've just concluded Revelation. We've gone through over a dozen books in the Bible like this, in no particular order; occasionally by chapter,

most times a few verses each day. Sometimes I regret that I didn't start this sort of interaction earlier. Then again, each time I close my message and text, "I love you boys", I simply give thanks that we started this process at all. In 2019, I challenge you to begin your own practice of sharing God's word. Maybe it's with a friend or family member, or maybe it's with a brother or sister in Christ. Either way, I'm confident God will be honored, and you'll see fruit. My son was seeking Godly guidance, and I was blessed to be the one from whom he chose to receive it. Who will you share the Good News with?
