The website Sermonwriter.com says this about this hymn that is in every Christian song book.

What would it mean if Christ were our vision? How would it change our lives?

It would mean simply this—that instead of seeing the world through the eyes of a Madison Avenue advertising agent or a Hollywood movie or a television newscaster, we would see the world through Christ's eyes.

It would change our lives, because seeing the world through Christ's eyes would cause us to love as Christ loved. It would cause us to focus less on getting the things that we want and more on giving

what we can to help others. It would cause us to care less about other people's opinions and more about the direction that God would have our lives to take.

TLC's Call Team is in the process of finding our next pastor. They will look at the pastoral candidates through Jesus' eyes. They have to determine which pastor Jesus would select. They will look at qualifications and experience of the candidates but will also look for the heart of Christ in the candidates. The kind of pastor that we all would love and support.

Think about what kind of church TLC would become if we all looked through Christ's eyes and loved each other as Christ does. Everyone remembers the WWJD slogan that was popular a few years back. When we had problems or tough decisions to make, we would ask "What would Jesus do? ". If we do this, we would spend less time on getting things we want and focus on what Jesus wants for His church. Christ's priorities were about loving and caring for one another and those that need love in our community.

How do we determine what it means to look through Jesus eyes or what to do what Jesus would do? How do we know what it is to love with the love of Christ? The apostle John tells us. Jesus is the Word of God sent to us by the Father and the Bible tells us everything we need to know about Jesus and His plan for His church.

The Church Council is committed to seeing more Bible Study and Prayer opportunities for the congregation. We are preparing to create a Men's small group. If anyone would like to start other small groups, Pastor Barb, the Congregational Care and Fellowship committees can help you with small group resources and direction on how to get started.
