"Take care lest you forget your God by not keeping His commandments and His rules and His statutes, which I command you today, lest, when you have eaten and are full and have built good houses and live in them...then your heart be lifted up, and you forget the LORD your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery...Beware lest you say in your heart, "My power and might of my hand have gotten me this wealth." What a blessing we have in Christ! As we go through these few sunny and warm months, and as we spend time enjoying the things that bring us joy as we are living in such a beautiful area, let us always remember that we are blessed all the more by the free gifts of God, found in His grace and mercy poured upon us, through Jesus Christ.

#### **Letter from Trinity President**

On May 10-11th, the TLC Leadership Team met for their annual workshop. The Leadership Team consists of Pastors Dan and Barb, Council members, Lay Worship Assistants, Planning Team members and church staff. This important gathering allowed us time of reflection on the 5-year plan for TLC and hearing what God was calling the church to do. Even before doing the business of the workshop, we spent time in worship and in individual prayer. Each workshop participant found a quiet place to take time to listen what the Holy Spirit had to say to us. Many times, we all get so much in a hurry we forget to include God in our business. At the last few annual workshops, the Leadership Team studied and discussed chapters from Thom Rainer's book, Autopsy of a Deceased Church, 12 Ways to Keep yours Alive. (Disclaimer: We don't think TLC is dying. Far from it. We are learning from this book, ways how to keep our church vibrant and alive.) This is what Rainer said about the New Testament example churches should follow regarding prayer. "It was the first church, the Jerusalem church. Many had become Christians and they began to gather together in places at Jerusalem. Luke, with his eye for detail and historical accuracy, describes the early days of the church in Acts 2:42: 'And they devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching, to fellowship, to the breaking of bread, and to prayers." Don't read too quickly past the word "devoted" in Acts 2:42. The word meaning has much intensity and deliberation. It is like a wild hungry beast ready to devour its prey. When the Jerusalem church members devoted themselves to prayer, they were doing a lot more than reading names off a list. They were fervent, intense, and passionate about prayer. They had no doubt that God was listening and responding. A failure to pray was tantamount to a failure to breathe. Prayer was not an add-on to give them permission to eat a meal. It was serious stuff for a serious group of church members."

With all the strife and problems going on in this world and the important decisions we must make on how to minister to this world, I'm asking that we as a congregation would be devoted to Biblical teaching, to fellowship with one another, to the Sacrament of Communion and especially to prayer. When the Acts Christian Church were devoted to prayer, they received the power of the Holy Spirit and the church grew by thousands of new believers. Please fervently and passionately join me in praying that:

- Our congregation and visitors would be fed by the Word of God, Biblical teaching, and loving fellowship
- Our Pastors and their families would have time for rest and relaxation, time for personal study and prayer time.
- Our Leadership Team would be filled with God's wisdom and discernment, be energized, and empowered to fulfill God's plan for TLC
- Our communities would be open to receiving the grace and love of Christ.

And this is the confidence that we have toward him, that if we ask anything according to his will, he hears us. And if we know that he hears us in whatever we ask, we know that we have the requests that we have asked of him. 1 John 5:14–15

Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you. 1 Thessalonians 5:16–18


