Rolf and I have gotten to know so many precious brothers and sisters in Christ Jesus here at Trinity. As I start my new role as temporary interim pastor of Trinity church, I'm so very thankful for all the encouragement, warm hugs and prayers I have received here at Trinity. I trust in the

Lord to lead and guide me as I strive to preach and teach His Word. We have an excellent council and we will work and pray together asking God to lead us through the challenges and ministry that awaits us. Jesus is head of the church and we believe He will guide, strengthen, and give us wisdom in leading our congregation. President's Message

What to look for in a Church?

That is the title of the commentary in The New Believers Bible for Acts 2:42-44,47. The scripture reads :

"All the believers devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching, and to fellowship, and to sharing in meals (including the Lord's Supper), and to prayer. And all the believers met together in one place and shared everything they had. They sold their property and possessions and shared the money with those in need. They worshiped together at the Temple each day, met in homes for the Lord's Supper, and shared their meals with great joy and generosity — all the while praising God and enjoying the goodwill of all the people. And each day the Lord added to their fellowship those who were being saved.

Acts 2:42,44-47 NLT

Listen to what the commentator says: The first century church turned the world upside down with its message. What made the early church so dynamic was the commitment of its members to follow Christ wholeheartedly. When you look for a church to attend, make sure it has these five characteristics of a healthy church.

- 1. Look for a Church that meets regularly. The early church didn't view the church as a social club, but as a place for devoted fellowship and valuable instruction. We miss out on a tremendous blessing when we neglect meeting together with God's people. When we are spiritually weak, we should not run from church but to church.
- 2. Look for a Church that places high value on Bible Study. The first-century Christians devoted themselves to the apostles' teachings. The apostles' teachings on the life and ministry of Jesus eventually became the Gospels portion of the New Testament. Studying the Bible is important to every Christian's spiritual growth. Without Bible Study, Christians cannot know and understand God's commands and truth.
- 3. Look for a Church that is a Place of Corporate Worship and Prayer. The early church recognized the importance of corporate worship and prayer. Corporate Worship focused their attention on the praiseworthy character of God and gave them an opportunity to express their thanks to God. Corporate Prayer allowed them to express their thanks as well, but it was also an opportunity to seek God together and present their

requests before him as a body.

- 4. Look for a Church that looks after its members. The early believers shared food, clothing, and housing with each other. The Bible reminds us to care for fellow believers who are in need. See 2 Corinthians 9:1-15.
- 5. Look for a Church that is growing. Church growth is not our responsibility but God's. If we do our part as a church, God will do his. We see proof of this in Acts 2:47.

The early Christian believers created a community using these five characteristics. These characteristics are what people are looking for when seeking a new church or looking for when deciding to return to TLC. These characteristics are good goals TLC should be striving for in the

next few years. The Council and Ministry Teams need your help to give us your thoughts on how to reach these goals. On March 20-21, we have trained church assessors coming to conduct individual conversations with each of you to gather information on what skills our new pastor will need and how to improve in the five areas listed above. Please sign up for an individual appointment at the Welcome Center to give your opinions and suggestions in a confidential nonthreatening conversation with friendlycaring people. This is your opportunity to take ownership of your membership in your church. If the timing of the appointments doesn't work out for you, we will have questionnaires that you can pick up at the Welcome Center. Once completed you can turn them in to the church office.



Our mission statement is "We are a **community** brought together through God's grace and love, seeking to grow in faith and knowledge in Jesus Christ, and reaching out in word and action to our community and beyond with the good news of Jesus' love."

Each of you are needed and wanted in the TLC community. Continue to pray with us that God will transform TLC into the community God wants us to be. With God's help we can turn our world upside down just as the first century Christian Church did.

OUTREACH

Lent is a 6-week period of time used to prepare for Easter. We, as Christians, are to be quiet and thoughtful when preparing ourselves for Easter.

Certain traditions for years have reminded us of what Lent is. We think of a time of repentance, doing penance and alms-giving or giving to charities. We are challenged to give up some of the things we might otherwise do for pleasure and deny ego. Or do we handle self-denials in much the same way we go about sticking to New Year's resolutions?

I see Lent as one of biggest challenge we are presented with to "Live Third!"

Trinity's Outreach Committee project for the month of March will be collecting items for "Project Promise Personal Care Kits" for LWR (Lutheran World Relief)

These kits are shared with people who have lost everything from a natural disaster or life-threatening violence. *Give hope with a bar of soap!*

The "Baskets of Hope" will be set up in the narthex starting Ash Wednesday and collecting will continue until Palm Sunday. There are 5 items needed for a complete kit. There will be a list of items needed and the week they will be collected. This is only a suggestion. Feel free to give any item when it is convenient for you.

Any personal/health care items donated that are not on LWR list will be given to the BW Food Pantry.

I'm not sure if many people actually know what LWR is or does.

It was founded in 1945. LWR is an international, non-government organization focused on sustainable developmental projects, disaster relief and recovery. Originally formed to help those whose homes and lives were devastated by WWII in Europe.

Kits of Care give families around the world some of life's essential as a reminder they are not alone. They assist in cases of chronic poverty and conflict to drought and typhoon.

Making quilts and/or kits strengthens fellowship within the congregation. At present there are only 2 quilters that are members of Trinity! But we can witness our faith to our community.

Cleanliness may not actually be next to godliness, but it certainly helps a person feel more human.

When families find their homes destroyed or must flee for their safety, a towel and soap is rarely taken with. Arriving in a refugee camp or any safe place they are fearful, vulnerable and dirty. The simple items that are in Personal Care Kit provide much needed self-care, critical germ fighting plus a chance to regain their dignity despite being in a place of uncertainty.

We are challenged to live third and what better time to give than Lent!
