## **BRIGHTER DAYS AHEAD**

Earlier this year the church council voted to become more energy efficient by taking advantage of the energy rebates offered through Focus on Energy. This meant changing out all the light bulbs, ballasts and changing some of the exterior fixtures. The project took place mid-summer by Meyers Electric. Meyers Electric worked with Focus on Energy and Xcell Energy. The required paperwork was completed for the available rebates. Here is how the financing for this project came out:



Contractor cost to Trinity Lutheran Church was \$3,440.13

Rebate check from Focus on Energy back to Trinity Lutheran Church was \$2,220.00

Rebate check from energy supplier back to Trinity Lutheran Church was \$740.00

VICE PRESIDENT: Serve as vice-chair of the Congregation Council and act on behalf of the chair when the President is unable to attend or participate; and provide leadership and serve as a resource to Ministry Teams.

#### TREASURER:

- Oversee all financial matters, and ensure that acceptable accounting methods are used in keeping all books of account;
- Advise the Congregation Council of financial status and implications of short and long-term decisions;
- Submit written reports to all Congregation Council and Congregation meetings;
- Shall prepare the proposed budget for the ensuing year.
- Approve and sign all checks issued.

#### FINANCIAL SECRETARY:

- Be charged with the responsibility for counting the offering after every service at which an offering is taken. (Teams have been created for each week.)
- Oversee and record the receipts of offering and other gifts; and
- Be responsible for putting together and distributing biannual statements of members' giving.

congregational care: Shall have responsibility for recruiting, training and sending out members to assist the pastor with pastoral care of congregation members; may include visiting persons who are hospitalized, homebound or in nursing homes; shall see to the recording and delivery of audio recordings of worship services, offering grief support and other kind of assistance to persons in need.

EDUCATION, YOUTH & FAMILY: Shall have charge of education and faith activities of this congregation, including Sunday School, Vacation Bible School (VBS), youth activities, and adult education.

**EVANGELISM:** Shall direct efforts at reaching out to persons outside this community of faith; shall create and distribute publicity regarding church activities; shall provide information to worship guests and organize follow-up visits to such guests and other persons interested in the life and ministry of this congregation.

WORSHIP & MUSIC: shall have special responsibility for matters pertaining to this congregation's worship life; shall recruit and nominate a Minister of Music, choir director (s), and organist(s); shall recruit, train and schedule ushers, greeters, communion servers, and other worship assistants.

Our new Youth and Family Ministry Coordinator, Ashley Beffa, and I are VERY excited to announce a great opportunity for our community students, grades 6-12, to experience incredible growth in their relationship with Jesus! The Cross Youth Ministry

## **Guiding Scripture:**

"18 For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God." 1 Corinthians 1:18

#### Mission:

With the help of the Lord, through the use of His faithful servants in our congregation, The Cross will teach, model, guide and mentor youth toward a closer relationship with their savior Jesus Christ.

#### Focus:

Our focus at The Cross is to encourage our students to develop lifelong habits of daily Bible reading, service of others, and prayer. We have begun to do this through a chapter-bychapter focus on the Gospel of John.



Our small groups of students and mentors read, journal, and pray individually, as well as in group, while moving through this entire Gospel during the year.

#### Methods:

Our adult leaders are expected to, and instructed to, model the mission and focus we hold at The Cross. In an effort to encourage their students to read, pray and know the Lord, small group leaders are asked to connect with their students 2-3 times outside The Cross throughout the week. We believe this will foster the building of healthy mentorships with Christ-following adults as well; teaching our students to live as HE lived.

Schedule: (The Cross meets each Wednesday\* from 5:30 – 7:15. Visitors are always welcome!)

**5:30** students fellowship with their peers by playing games, eating snacks, and interacting while watching Christian music videos in the designated youth area.

**6:15** announcements, group message/video/teaching by staff or guest.

**6:30** small group meeting by age group (grades 6-8 & high school) In small groups students are reading their Bible, journaling, discussing scripture meaning, and praying together.

Students are encouraged to bring friends at any time, whether members or not, whether believers or not.

**7:15-7:20** students dismissed for pick up

\*The 3<sup>rd</sup> Wednesday of each month is set aside to practice living as He lived: Third.




sent into the world to proclaim the gospel message that a new light is comin'.


