This is the perfect opportunity for those who aren't able to make the year-long commitment to sing with the Trinity Choir.


If you are high-school age or older, and want to sing in the Cantata

Trinity Lutheran will participate in Operation Christmas Child Shoebox Packing on November 9

Bins will be available for donations (including boxes) the week of Oct 28 and Nov 4 as well as completed boxes your family creates in advance!

The Samaritan's Purse project Operation Christmas Child collects shoebox gifts filled with fun toys, school supplies and hygiene items—and delivers them to children in need around the world to demonstrate God's love in a tangible way. Each box packed full of quality toys, school supplies and personal care items becomes a physical expression of God's love for the child. For many, it is their first gift ever! Delivered by local church partners, shoebox gifts provide an opportunity to present the Gospel to boys and girls in a clear, child-friendly way. Box Labels will go on average sized shoeboxes for Girls and Boys 2-4 yrs old, 5-9

yrs old and 10-14 yrs old. You may gift wrap the box and lid if you choose.

Consider including a WOW item, personal care items, school supplies, clothing or accessories, craft and activities and toys.

A WOW item:

Girl: Doll, Large Toy, Soccer ball/pump, stuffed animal, musical instrument

Boy: Soccer ball/pump, stuffed animal, musical instrument, large toy truck or car

Don't forget to also include a personal note and photo – sometimes these are the child's favorite things to receive!

Personal Care Items: comb or brush, toothbrush, washcloth, fun adhesive bandages, eating utensils, nail clipper and file

School Supplies: pencils/sharpeners, pencil case, erasers, pens, crayons, markers, notebooks, index cards, calculator, scissors, ruler, glue stick, small adhesive tape

Clothing and Accessories: clothing and undergarments, flip-flops or shoes, cold weather items, sunglasses, bags, backpacks or purses, hair accessories, hats, wristwatch or jewelry, flashlight with batteries

Crafts or Activities: puzzles, binoculars, compass, chalkboard and chalk, fishing kit, jump rope, coloring books or pads, dry watercolor set, playdough, stickers, craft kits or colorful rope/twine, books or picture books

Toys: ball, frisbee, building blocks, finger puppets, slinky, yo-yo, magnets, kaleidoscope, interactive toys, small figurines

Pray: for the child receiving the box to be receptive to the Holy Spirit and the Good News of Jesus Christ, for the pastor of the church delivering your box and the child's community.

Donate: Each box needs a \$10 donation to cover shipping and project costs. Information will be provided regarding the donation. If an online option is used, you can Follow Your Box and discover the destination of your gifts! A Donation Box will also be provided in the Narthex!

Do not include: Candy; toothpaste; gum; used or damaged items; scary or warrelated items such as toy guns, knives, or military figures; chocolate or food; seeds; fruit rolls or other fruit snacks; drink mixes (powdered or liquid); liquids or lotions; medications or vitamins; breakable items such as snow globes or glass containers; aerosol cans.
