#### FAITH5 FESTIVAL INTRODUCES FAITH FORMATION SERIES

Get ready Trinity Family for FAITH5 FESTIVAL on Sunday, September 10! We'll be kicking off a six-week series during the worship service that focuses on FAITH5 (Faith Acts In The Home). After worship, all are invited to share a potluck meal in the Fellowship Hall.

Recently, seven Trinity members attended a workshop on the future of faith formation in our Post-Television, Post-Sunday School, Neo-Google World. They learned about FAITH5 as one way to equip each of us with a simple, easy-to-implement faith practice, perfect for incorporating into your bedtime routine for five to fifteen minutes each night. Our middle school youth are already learning this practice in their confirmation instruction. The five steps are:

- \*SHARE your highs and lows
- ❖READ a Bible verse or story
- ❖ TALK about how the Bible reading might relate to your highs and lows
- \*PRAY for one another's highs and lows
- \*BLESS one another



Over the course of the subsequent weeks, through October 15, each of the five steps will be the focus of the sermon, music, and worship experience. So be prepared on September 10 for some changes in the worship service – not too big, not too small – just right "Goldilocks" changes!

#### PASTOR JOAN'S COLUMN

In the coming weeks, you will hear more about *Share, Read, Talk, Pray,* and *Bless* - the Faith5; in fact, work has started on the bulletin board outside the Sanctuary with this theme. You will also hear about crosst generational ministry and what it means for the future of Trinity as well as the Church as a whole.

In thinking about the future of the Church and Trinity in particular, we have to ask ourselves the question: "Will Trinity Lutheran Church still be in existence in 25 years, in 50 years?" Our hearts might say "yes," but when we look at statistics, it appears that the Church in America is dying. According to the Hartford Institute of Religion Research, more than 40 percent of Americans "say" they go to church weekly, but in reality, less than 20 percent are actually in church. In other words, more than 80 percent of Americans are finding more fulfilling things to do on weekends. (Blog post by Steve McSwain, "Why Nobody Wants to Go to Church Anymore," updated Jan 23, 2014.)



I don't want to bore you with numbers, but we need to pay attention to this trend in our country and what it means for Trinity. We have already experienced the decline of young families in worship each week, and last year, we had an average of one child for Sunday school each week. There is no simple answer for this phenomenon, and no simple solution, either. However, that doesn't mean we should merely ignore it and plod on just as we always have. And everyone at Trinity has a stake in this because if we are being Christ-imitators, as we should be, we

have a vested interest in preserving the church body of Trinity for future generations - for our children, grandchildren, and greatgrandchildren, and on and on. Notice I said the "church body." That doesn't mean the physical building. I'm talking about the people who

gather together each week to worship our Lord and Savior corporately, to join in fellowship with one another, and to love and support one another. Being a Christian was never meant to be a solitary existence: "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, teaching and admonishing one another in all wisdom, singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, with thankfulness in your hearts to God" (Colossians 3:16 ESV).

Therefore, I am proposing that each and every person who attends worship regularly at Trinity open your minds and hearts to CHANGE! Yes, it's that nasty word that no one likes, and everyone cowers when they hear it (except me - I love change, I embrace change, change makes life interesting). And it




might mean change in the way we worship, but I promise you that as long as I am preaching at Trinity (or in any church), the one thing that will not change is the Gospel of Jesus Christ!

#### FAITH EDUCATION BY LEARNING GOD'S WORD TOGETHER

**All Heart. All Soul. All Might.** Three areas that God has commanded to us. We at Trinity are hopeful and passionate to engage and equip you and your family to study and learn God's word in the Bible through a fun and interactive way. We promote learning through Bible study, fellowship and service!

Our **Sunday School** ministry for ages pre-K through 5th is undergoing some exciting changes to provide new opportunities for learning how much God loves us. We are going to be intentional in providing learning with young and old learning together — **Generations In Faith Together** — **G.I.F.T.** as part of Faith Inkubators' FAITH5. What new joys await you when 8-year-olds, 80-year-olds and everyone in-between are regularly applying highs and lows to the texts and contexts — the Scriptures and the real issues of their lives?

Our ministry for **Middle School** youth, grades 6th, 7th, and 8th is filled with fun during the three year commitment with a focus each year on either the Old Testament, the New Testament, and the Catechism. Other topics may include prayer, leading a Christian life, or standing firm in our faith. Within the three years of confirmation it is our hope that children and all of the adults participating will have a greater understanding of God's Word and His relationship with us.

The curriculum is from Faith Inkubators and it is called Head to the Heart (H2H). H2H is based on the latest in adolescent brain research, helping kids retain the info and worship together. This is done through combining current life with Biblical truths, creating critical thinking, deep caring, faithful young people. It features art, music, skits, and gameshows, while building lasting caring relationships at church.

**9th grade youth** will have 7 months to learn and confirm their faith through a Bible study with a mentor. Pastor Joan will be connecting with families to further discuss the study for youth on their journey to affirm their baptism.

**High School** youth will have an opportunity to participate in our **Generations in Faith Together—G.I.F.T**. and participate in service opportunities and mission work. LOVE IN ACTION! We look forward to planning with you to show our love for our Savior!

**Faith formation for adults** is available through both peer group Bible studies and generational focus. There are two Monday night studies, one video series on Wednesday mornings, and one Thursday morning study. Please see the calendar for details.

Pre- K through older are invited to 10 am worship and learn the scripture by participating and engaging together.
We will equip adults and engage children through art and involvement during church worship.
